VGCA Board of Trustees

Meetings:

- The VGCA Board of Trustees has a work session on the first Friday of each month. We meet at 8:30am in
 the meeting room at the clubhouse. This is an open meeting any <u>homeowner</u> is welcome to attend. If you
 have a specific issue that you would like addressed by the Board, please notify the VGCA Office by
 Wednesday noon before the meeting day.
- For calendar purposes, the Board has scheduled bimonthly homeowners meetings in 2025. Meetings will
 be held on an as needed basis.
- Meeting minutes are made available to homeowners on the VGCA website and are included in the weekly community eMail update that is sent out on Sundays.

Finances:

- The Treasurer's report to the Board at our February work session we are still waiting for the vendor
 invoicing process to close out 2024 fiscal year.
 - Motion made to carry forward the surplus funds from year ending in 2023 in the amount of \$40,057 for future operating contingencies. Motion for approval offered by Frank Keller, motion seconded by Gene Friedman. Motion carried by unanimous vote.
 - Motion made to move \$163,699.66 in the Reserve Money Market account from PWB (Pacific West Bank) which is earning approximately .80% to EBT (Enterprise Bank & Trust) which is earning approximately 2.15%. Motion for approval offered by Terri Edelman, motion seconded by Gene Friedman. Motion carried by unanimous vote.
 - Set up Petty Cash vendor for community BOT voted to establish a "petty cash" funded initially with \$200.00 with Terri Edelman (Treasurer) as the vendor. Angel created a tracking sheet for this account.

Planned Expenditures / Project Status:

- <u>Clubhouse Gym</u>: as reported previously, we purchased an Elliptical for the gym. Originally, it was to
 replace the stationary bike. However, based on resident feedback, we decided to keep the bike. We
 rearranged the gym to accommodate both exercise machines. Also, the ceiling HVAC registers were closed
 in response to reports that the gym was too hot.
- <u>Clubhouse Exterior</u>: we are securing bids for the refresh of the clubhouse entrance. We hope to begin work
 on this project in early Spring. Response to requests for bids has been slow. Scope of the work: new doors,
 replace trim work, install new siding for a more uniformed appearance, and install new side lights.
- <u>Clubhouse Library</u>: final plans for the library include replacing the carpet with the same carpet planks used
 in the main room and painting the walls a deep blue. Woodwork will remain the same color. Currently, we
 see no need to build additional shelving.
- <u>Clubhouse Water Heater</u>: our plumber has been contacted to purchase and install a new water heater for the clubhouse.

Landscape Management:

- We continue to address storm related debris clean-up activity in common areas.
- YTD (2/7/2025) expenses for snow events are approximately \$22,000.

Running for the VG Board of Trustees — Do I Have What it Takes?

If you're considering running for the board, we ask that you take a few moments to ask yourself the following three questions:

Do I have the time? As a board member, you will need to devote at least several hours of your time each month to association business. In addition to regular monthly board meetings, you will need to be active in email discussions and occasional special meetings. During special projects, you may need to spend a little extra time on association business. Some board members may also spend a little more time than others if they work with a committee.

Can I make tough decisions when it's required? The primary role of the board is to conduct the business of the association. This doesn't just mean approving the budget, but also developing and enforcing policies. Board members are required to step outside their immediate circle of family and neighbors and make decisions based on the greater good of the community.

Can I do all this and have fun, too? It isn't all about policies and tough decisions. Our community is only as good as we make it. Establishing and maintaining a sense of community is a part of a board member's responsibility. Planning and attending events and activities and being a presence in the community are as important as any policy decisions you may make.

Being a board member can be frustrating at times, but it may also be one of the most rewarding ways you'll find to volunteer your time. If you're interested in running for the Board of Trustees, please refer to this newsletter for additional information.

Village Greenes Community Association (VGCA) 2025 Annual Board of Trustees Official Election Notice

In accordance with Article III Section 3.8 and Article IV Section 4.1 – 4.4 of the Village Greenes Community Association (VGCA) By Laws, the election of Trustees shall take place. Each year during the months of March and April, the VGCA Election Committee initiates and completes a homeowner election process.

The VGCA Board of Trustees consists of five (5) elected Trustees. Each election year varies in the number of Nomination Applications solicited for open Trustee seats. In odd years, such as 2025, there are three (3) seats open on the Board. In that year, each household will vote for three (3) homeowners running to fill those seats. In even years, such as 2026, there are two (2) seats open on the Board. In that year, each household will vote for two (2) homeowners running to fill those seats.

NJ Radburn Law Regulations

Our annual Board of Trustee elections must comply with regulations set forth in the Radburn Law published by the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs, Division of Codes and Standards (DCA). The following are the provisions of that law which are the most significant:

- Anonymous Voting Required all ballots shall be cast in an anonymous manner. Boards should implement a
 system that allows for confirmation of member voting which preserves the anonymity of the vote.
 - <u>VGCA compliance</u> VG Election Committee shall use the recommended double envelope process to ensure the anonymity of the person(s) submitting the ballot.
- Write-In Candidates the ballot shall include space for write-in candidates for as many seats that are up for election.
 - <u>VGCA compliance</u> VG Election committee will include three (3) write-in spaces for the 2025 election cycle.
- A Sample Meeting Ballot Must be Provided with Notice of Election The election meeting notice shall include a copy of the ballot marked "Sample."
 - <u>VGCA compliance</u> VG Election Committee will provide a "sample" election ballot in the Notice of Election Mailing.
- Counting Ballots all ballot tallying shall occur publicly.
 - <u>VGCA compliance</u> VG Election Committee shall schedule a "Counting the Ballots" meeting open to all homeowners. Ballots will be opened and counted at that meeting. This meeting is scheduled for <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>April 30</u>, <u>2025</u> at 6:30 PM in the clubhouse.
- Inspection of Ballots ballots shall be open to inspection by any member of the association for a period of 90 days from the date of the election. Anonymity of the vote must be maintained.
 - <u>VGCA compliance</u> VG Election Committee will assist in this process if requested by any homeowner in good standing.

VGCA NOMINATION PROCESS

Notice for Nomination Applications & Deadline – a notice is hereby given that the Nomination Application period for the 2025 BOT election begins on March 1, 2025 and ends on March 20, 2025.

Nomination Applications are included with this March 2025 Newsletter.

Nomination Applications received after March 20, 2025 will not be accepted.

- Any homeowner in good standing may nominate himself or herself to be a candidate.
- Any homeowner in good standing may nominate another homeowner in good standing as a candidate. That
 homeowner must agree to having his or her name placed on the ballot.

There is no limit to the number of homeowners who may run in each election.

This year, three (3) seats for a two (2) year term effective April 30, 2025 will be open for any VGCA homeowner in good standing wanting to serve on the Board of Trustees. The three seats currently held by Bob Gilinger, Terri Edelman, and Frank Keller are up for election. There will be a deposit box in the vestibule of the clubhouse for you to securely return your Nomination Application. Or you can choose to return your Nomination Application by mail – but make sure you allow time for it to be processed through the mail system.

VG ELECTION PROCESS:

VGCA By Laws allow only <u>homeowners</u> to participate in the election process. Every homeowner in good standing is eligible to vote in the election. However, only one ballot sheet may be submitted for each household. Therefore, in the situation where there are two or more homeowners in the same house, you must come to a consensus on your selection(s) and submit only one ballot reflecting that consensus.

Notice for "Meet the Candidates Night" – once the Nomination Application period has ended, the VGCA
Election Committee will sponsor a "Meet the Candidates Night." This will be your opportunity to meet the
candidates, listen to their qualifications and reason for running. You will also be given an opportunity to ask
each candidate questions. This meeting will be held Wednesday, April 9th at 7:00 PM in the VG Clubhouse. If
three or fewer candidates are running for the three open seats, Meet the Candidates Night" will be canceled.

The meeting will be moderated by Elaine O'Neal, VG Election Committee Chairperson. Rules of decorum for the meeting will be set by the VG Election Committee.

Notice of Election – voting takes place April 9, 2025 through April 23, 2025. All voting ballots must be returned to the VG Clubhouse on or before April 23, 2025. Each household may vote for one, two, or three of the candidates running for the 3 open seats. There will be a deposit box in the vestibule of the clubhouse for you to securely return your ballot. Or you can choose to return your ballot by mail – but make sure you allow time for it to be processed through the mail system. Election ballots received after April 23, 2025 will NOT be counted. Election ballots will be counted on Election Night – Wednesday, April 30, 2025 at 7:00 PM in the VG Clubhouse. This event is open to all VG homeowners.

Election Ballot Kit and process to insure voter anonymity:

- One ballot sheet for each household will be included in the election package.
- Ouble envelope to return ballot Outside envelope ("Return Envelope to VG") will have the homeowner's name(s) and a spot for signature(s). The inside envelope ("VG Ballot Sheet Envelope") will have no identification and will be used by the homeowner to include their ballot in the return process.
- Homeowners return one ballot sheet per household, placing it in the VG Ballot Sheet Envelope and sealing that envelope. The VG Ballot Sheet Envelope is put into the outside Return to VG envelope identifying the homeowner(s). It is returned to the VG Management Office.
- O Upon receipt of the envelope, the VG Office Manager records that a ballot was received from the homeowner(s). The VG Office Manager removes the inside VG Ballot Sheet Envelope containing the ballot and securely stores it until election night. The outside envelope with the homeowner's name and signature is kept separately and must be maintained for a period of 90 days.
- There is NO record of how the homeowner voted, only that a ballot was received. Only the VG Ballot Sheet Envelopes are delivered to the Election Committee on Election Night.

Counting of Election Ballots:

- The VG Office Manager will provide the Election Committee with a count of the VG Ballot Sheet Envelopes received, and the actual batches of the VG Ballot Sheet Envelopes.
- The VG election committee will count the returned VG Ballot Sheet Envelopes prior to opening them to make sure all returned ballots are at the counting site.
- The VG election committee will open the envelope containing the ballot sheet.
- The ballot sheet is passed to a separate counting area where it is inspected to be a valid ballot.
- The ballot is counted by the Election Committee counters. Ballot counting will be twice verified and supervised by the Election Judge (as appointed by the Election Committee chairperson).
- Once certified as complete and accurate by the Election Judge, the results will be communicated to the nominees and the community members.

PROCLAMATIONS

Mayor Veasey and Council recognized January 2025 as Muslim Heritage month in New Jersey.

PRESENTATIONS

• Affordable Housing presentation given by Chris Dochney who is the Township Affordable Housing Planner. In 2024 a new law was signed by the Governor assigning every Township in New Jersey their "Fair Share" obligation for providing low and moderate priced housing. Evesham's obligation is:

111 rehabilitation units

220 new construction units

The plan must be in place by June, 2025.

ORDINANCES – FIRST READING (public hearing to be held February 12th) All Passed 5 – 0.

- Amends the Salary Ordinance to account for 2025 salary increases.
- Adopts a municipal budget increase of 3-1/2%. Current statute limits budget increases to 2-1/2 % or to Cost of Living increase.
- Adopts an increase of fees Township can charge for towing and storage of vehicles.
- Amends how the Municipal Prosecutor is paid for services.
- Adopts a Redevelopment Plan for the Centre Boulevard Redevelopment Area. Designates the professional and medical office park located at 100 112 Centre Blvd. as an area in need of redevelopment. The vacancy rate is currently greater than 25%. The plan envisions the development of a contemporary multifamily residential project including accommodation for low and moderate priced housing.

- \bullet Appointment of three members to the Evesham Municipal Utilities Authority (MUA). Passed 4-0. (Councilwoman Cooper abstained)
- Appointment of a Zoning Board member. Passed 5 0.
- Rescinding appointment of the Chief Municipal Prosecutor. Passed 5-0.
- \bullet Establishes the Township's obligation for low and moderate priced housing pursuant to the Fair Housing Act. Passed 5-0.

• Forty-Seven resolutions presented - All passed 5 - 0.

MAYORAL APPOINTMENT

• Mayor Veasey appointed a new member to the Evesham Economic Advisory Council.




